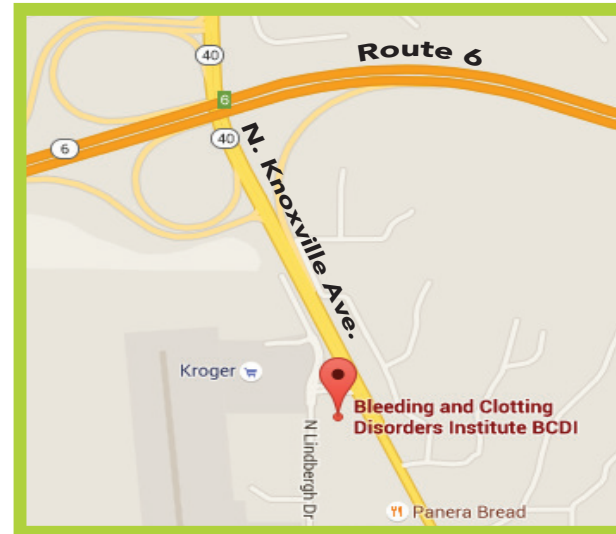

Michael D. Tarantino, MD, is the Medical Director at the Bleeding & Clotting Disorders Institute and a Professor in the Department of Pediatrics and the Department of Medicine at the University of Illinois College of Medicine at Peoria. He received his medical

degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison School of Medicine before completing an internship and residency in the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Arizona. Dr. Tarantino completed a fellowship in Pediatric Hematology/Oncology/Blood & Marrow Transplantation at the University of Wisconsin Children's Hospital in Madison. Dr. Tarantino is board-certified in Pediatric Hematology/Oncology/Blood & Marrow Transplantation.

Dr. Tarantino is a member of the American Academy of Pediatrics, American Society of Hematology, Hemophilia and Thrombosis Research Society, National Hemophilia Foundation, World Federation of Hemophilia, and International Society of Thrombosis and Hemostasis, among others. He also serves on the Medical Advisory and Scientific Council of the National Hemophilia Foundation and Medical Advisory Board of the Platelet Disorders Support Association. Dr. Tarantino has authored or co-authored over 200 peer-reviewed publications, journal articles, reviews, book chapters, and abstracts. He lectures extensively in the United States and abroad.

Jonathan Roberts, MD, is the Associate Medical & Research Director at the Bleeding & Clotting Disorders Institute. He received his medical degree from the Southern Illinois School of Medicine before completing an internship and residency in Pediatrics at the

University of Illinois College of Medicine at Peoria, where he received awards of excellence in clinical care and research. Dr. Roberts completed a fellowship in Pediatric Hematology/Oncology/Blood & Marrow Transplantation at the Medical College of Wisconsin/Children's Hospital of Wisconsin. He is board-certified in Pediatrics and Pediatric Hematology/Oncology/Blood & Marrow Transplantation.

Dr. Roberts received the Young Investigator Achievement Award from the American Society of Hematology (ASH) and International Society on Thrombosis and Haemostasis (ISTH) with his research featured at the 2014 Highlights of ASH. Dr. Roberts received an NHF clinical fellowship, where he received focused training and clinical experience allowing him to further his research. His clinical and translational research has been acknowledged by the National Hemophilia Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, and other sponsors. He has authored several peer-reviewed research publications and abstracts and has presented his research at national and international academic meetings. He also co-developed a new assay that has the potential to revolutionize clinical diagnosis of variant von Willebrand Disease.
